BLESSING OF THE ADVENT WREATH

Our help is in the name of the Lord.
Who made heaven and earth.

O God, by whose Word all things are sanctified,
pour forth Your blessing upon this wreath and
grant that we who use it may prepare our
hearts for the coming of Christ and may receive
from You abundant graces. We ask this
through Christ our Lord.
Amen.

The wreath is sprinkled with water. Then follows the prayer which is said before the evening meal each night of the first week in Advent.

FIRST WEEK The following prayer should be repeated each day during the first week. After the prayer, the first purple candle is lit.

O Lord, stir up your might, we beg you, and come, that by your protection we may deserve to be rescued from the threatening dangers of our sins and saved by your deliverance. Through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Collect for Purity

Almighty God to whom all hearts are open
all desires known and from whom no secrets are hid
cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit that we may perfectly love you and worthily magnify your holy Name; through Christ our Lord. Amen

Penitence

God so loved the world that he gave his only Son Jesus Christ to save us from our sins, to be our advocate in heaven, and to bring us to eternal life. Let us confess our sins in penitence and faith, firmly resolved to keep God's commandments and to live in love and peace with all.
