- 2. As we wait for and journey towards Christmas, may we find joy in hearing God speak to us in the scriptures and in Church so that we are spurred into action. Lord, grant us the grace to hear and do your will. Amen. We remember in prayer today those who live in Cowden Lane and Horns Road.
- 3. Coercive control, is the most pervasive form of domestic abuse. We thank God for legislation on this issue, and we pray for effective resourcing and implementation to enable victims and families to regain their lives. '...as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people'. Galatians 6:10 We pray for the people living in Delmonden Lane, and North Hill Road, and remember the parishes of Etchingham and Hurst Green.
- 4. Breaking the cycle of trafficking. We pray for families living in desperate situations, who are coaxed into trafficking children to orphanages or to other countries for work, believing they can have a better life. - 5. Healthy relationships matter. We pray that we may faithfully teach God's Word and that it may not be used as a tool to damage and abuse. Our love for God motivates and challenges us to keep this command: 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind; and Love your neighbour as yourself' Luke10:27.
