- 25. James the Apostle. But the wisdom that comes from heaven is first of all pure; then peace-loving, considerate, submissive, full of mercy and good fruit, impartial and sincere. - 31. Ignatius of Loyola, Founder of the Society of Jesus, 1556. Gracious God, you have promised through your prophets that Jerusalem will be home to many peoples, mothers to many nations. Hear our prayers that Jerusalem, the city of jour visitation, may be for all Jews, Christians and Muslims a place to dwell with you and to encounter one another in peace.
