What is a Hybrid Church?

The term hybrid church refers to a service conducted partially in person and partially online. Compared to traditional worship services, which are entirely within the church's facility, a hybrid church extends some or all of the worship service into the digital world. Whether a hybrid church service consists of sharing a recorded service on social media or is one component of a fullfledged online ministry, the model shares the worship experience with more people than those inside the church building.
